E.D. Aguilar announces resignation from the City of Charlottesville.


Message from the E.D. to the Community:

NEUTRAL EVALUATION

REPORT HAS BEEN COMPLETED AS SCHEDULED. SUBMITTED TO THE PARTIES ON SEPTEMBER 28, 2022. THE CPD REQUESTED A TWO-WEEK EXTENSION TO RESPOND WHICH WAS GRANTED BY THE COMPLAINANT. THE CPD WILL RESPOND ON OCTOBER 24, 2022 TO THE COMPLAINANT. THE COMPLAINANT WILL THEN HAVE 10-DAYS TO RESPOND.
