Downtown Mall Tree Removal Education Session to be Held

The City of Charlottesville Parks and Recreation Division will be removing nine trees on Charlottesville's Downtown Mall. Trees have been selected for removal due to concerns about the health and structural integrity of the individual trees. The fourth and final education session will be held on November 3 at 5:30 PM on the Downtown Mall. Attendees can meet City staff in front of the Parks & Recreation administration building, which is adjacent to the Market Street parking garage. No advanced registration is required.

Talent Supply Connector Initiative

On October 24, 2022, VA Career Works convened regional talent development stakeholders to form coalitions for the Light Manufacturing and Food & Beverage Manufacturing sectors. The kickoff meeting for their Talent Supply Connector initiative was held at the North Fork Meeting Center in Charlottesville. Representatives from local and area businesses, community colleges, adult education, career technical schools, and local government attended to learn more about supporting and expanding internship opportunities, apprenticeship programs and work-based learning experiences. Virginia Named the Top State for Business Climate in 2022

Virginia, a frequent top 10 finisher in Site Selection's annual ranking, beat out eight-consecutive winner Georgia for this year's first place standing. Texas placed third, with North Carolina and Arizona rounding out the top five. To determine the ranking of the best state business climates, surveys were sent to site selectors and an index was created to measure and identify the placings. The executives were also asked to prioritize their site location criteria, which revealed the attributes they considered to be present in the states with a strong business climate. Workforce skills—available today and in the future, was the number one priority, with tax climate and workforce development tying for second.
